Speakers

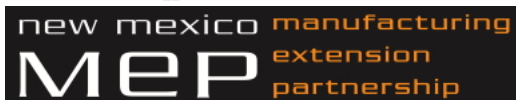

Dr. Winograd earned her doctor of education degree in Educational Leadership from the University of New Mexico, her master's degree in Higher Education Administration from the University of Louisville and her bachelor's degrees in Psychology and Therapeutic Recreation from Georgetown (Ky.) College. Dr. Winograd also serves on the boards of Presbyterian Healthcare Services, the United Way of Central New Mexico, the Greater Albuquerque Chamber of Commerce, the University of New Mexico Alumni Association and the Wells Fargo Leadership Board.
